

PORTWATCH

Portwatchers get another opportunity this week to see how the other half lives with the luxury motor-yacht "Archimedes" due to berth on Thursday and sail for Stewart Island on Sunday. If "Wabi Sabi" impressed the "Achimedes" should amaze as she is a much larger vessel, more of a small ship than a large yacht, and is built of steel rather than that bendy plastic stuff that the "Wabi Sabi" was made of. Among the 100 biggest yachts in the world "Archimedes" was built in 2008 and measures 1,100 gross tons on a length of 67.8 metres, beam of 12.3 metres and draught 3.5 metres, being powered by a pair of Caterpillar diesels developing 2,682 bhp each and driving twin screws to give a cruising speed of about 12 knots, with a maximum of about 16. Not particularly fast but if you're travelling at sea in such luxury who wants to

actually arrive anywhere? "Archimedes" is owned by James Simon, considered 'King of the hedge fund managers', who trained as a mathematician, pretty handy when working in financial markets and perhaps the reason for his yacht's name, then had a distinguished career teaching before founding Renaissance Technologies in 1982. Now retired James Simon is a generous philanthropist and, unlike most of the comparative paupers who comprise New Zealand's 'rich list', he shuns

publicity.

Less exotic ships also come to Bluff this week. Not many ships however, in fact just three. First expected is the "Buxstar" on Wednesday to exchange containers on the Capricorn Service of MSC. She will be followed on Thursday by the Greek-owned bulk carrier "Capetan Costis" bringing in coke from Longview, although not the sort of coke that hop-heads get excited about or that you can mix with rum and lime and call a Cuba Libre. Completed in Pusan, South Korea, in 2011 the "Capetan Costis" is, at 34,000 tonnes deadweight, approaching the upper end of the 'handy-size' range but when loaded draws less water than most of this class, compensated by a greater beam, allowing her to get larger cargoes into smaller ports of shallower depth. Finally the "Mandarin Arrow" arrives to load aluminium for the Far East.

Speaking of East, Easter has come and gone and, as usual, Old Norm and The Missus played host to Denise and Denephew over the Easter period. "Jesus Christ lives in my heart", the unctuous child replied to warm applause.


Denephew could contain himself no longer, "That's all rubbish - Jesus Christ lives in Old Norm's bathroom", he blurted.


